We have a great sporting tradition at Ashley Junior School. Our facilities and grounds lend themselves to a quality provision and we do all we can to ensure that children are provided with active, competitive and challenging sporting opportunities. Our main aim is participation and ensuring all children make the most of the opportunities presented.

Our 'Fit for Learning' award scheme encourages and rewards participation and involvement in sport and P.E. Our 'Sports Ambassadors' are equipped and coached to lead break-time activities for their peers.

Our P.E. Funding allocation for **2016-2017** is **£9160**. We are spending it on the following:
