



Task	<p>There is a wealth of children’s literature about modes of transport. For example: You can’t take an elephant on a bus by Patricia Coward; Room on the Broom by Julia Donaldson; and Cycle City by Alison Farrell. Read and/or listen to some of these stories and retell a section of it in another way – perhaps a comic strip, a news bulletin or a play.</p>  	<p>Research the top ten cars in the world for any of these categories: Fastest Most Expensive Most widely sold Most popular colour. Put them in order from highest to lowest and then present the data as a bar graph.</p>  	<p>Investigate the story of the Titanic. Find out: where it was made; where it sailed from; where it was headed; information about some interesting passengers. Present this as poster.</p> 
You could extend this by ...	<p>Creating your own picture book about a mode of transport. <i>Lots of children’s book rhyme. You could make this even more of a challenge by trying to make yours rhyme.</i></p> 	<p>1) Experimenting with different ways to present the data. For example pie charts, line graphs, tables, pictograms. <i>You would need to decide which one is most appropriate for your data set.</i></p>   <p>2) Creating a set of questions (with answers) that someone could solve from your graph. <i>For example: How much faster is Car A than Car B?</i></p>	<p>1) Taking on the role of a passenger and writing a diary to tell the story of your journey. <i>You would need to remember your work would need to be presented like a diary and include events in time order and description of feelings.</i> 2) Becoming a builder / designer. <i>The Titanic was supposed to be ‘unsinkable’. Design and/or build your own ‘unbreakable’ mode of transport. Explain what makes it ‘invincible’.</i></p>

Task	<p style="text-align: center;"><u>London Underground</u></p> <p>Art on the underground is a recent project designed to improve the journeys of millions of passengers on The Tube every day by brightening up the tunnels and stations.</p> <p>Research the project and some of the art installations and do a recreation of one of the pieces which is, or has been, on the walls at one of the stations.</p> <p><i>Be as creative as you can with the resources you use to make your pictures.</i></p> <div style="text-align: center;">  </div>	<p>Plan an exercise walk or cycle ride in the local area that takes you past at least 5 of these: Pub, shop, hotel, school, bridge, river or stream, woodland area, sports field, bank and garage or petrol station.</p> <p>Complete the route and return home safely – remember to stay alert and maintain social distancing as you do so.</p> <div style="text-align: center;">  </div>	<div style="text-align: center;">  </div> <p>Spitfire Prelude by William Walton one of Britain's greatest composers. The beginning is some of the finest writing in British music, remember the Spitfire was built close by in Southampton. https://youtu.be/GVSm_f7bO8s</p> <p>The Flying Dutchman. A Piece about a sailing ship cursed to sail the seas forever, never reaching land. Listen at 3 mins to the strings imitating the rolling sea. https://youtu.be/HgezCR_Xzal</p> <p>Coronation Scot . This piece tries to portray a steam train journey. Listen for the drum with brushes playing the rhythm of the train and the train whistle! https://youtu.be/VtchzNfcKvE</p> <p>Driving in My Car by Madness. A fun song and video.
